Bats The Bike Hub, 1025 N. Broadway, DePere. 8–9:30 pm. Sue Saari will explain the habits of Wisconsin bats and show us a live captive bat or two. Then she will lead us along the Fox River to find bats using an echo locator. Free for Audubon members, non-members adults \$5, children 17 and under \$3.
